LAPAROSCOPY FELLOW SCOTT V. BURGESS, M.D.

A lifelong fan of spicy food, Scott Vassar Burgess was psyched about spending a year in New Orleans.

"It is nice to have Tabasco and Crystal Hot Sauce on every table in the city," said Burgess, a Missouri native and laparoscopy and endourology fellow in the Department.

Born in Springfield, Missouri, Burgess traces his interest in medicine to childhood, admitting some nudging from his parents, both former longtime professors at Southwest Missouri State University.

Following his graduation with honors

from Springfield's Parkview High School, Burgess went on to study biological sciences at the University of Missouri at Columbia, where he walked the fine line between high-achieving academics and college-town diversion. A member of the Antlers, a basketball heckling squad he describes as "notorious," Burgess recalled when Tigers rival the Arkansas Razorbacks were in town:

"We went to the pig farm after they had slaughtered some hogs and took the pig heads and met the team bus with flaming pig heads on sticks," Burgess wrote in an e-mail to the Catheter. "Good clean fun."

Burgess stayed at Missouri for medical school, graduating in 1998, and did his residency in general surgery and then urology at William Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak, Michigan. Research presentations while there included "A failed black market kidney transplantation" and "A paradigm for robotic surgical development at a community hospital," both for the AUA, North Central Section meeting, in September 2003.

Having arrived at Tulane in July 2004, Burgess is a clinical instructor, also specializing in urodynamics. His fellowship here will end in July, and he will relocate to Williamsburg, Virginia, where he will be director of laparoscopic and robotic surgery at two area hospitals and also run a private practice. Burgess is moving with his wife, Danielle, and daughter, Charlotte, who will turn two in July. The family is expecting a second girl in August. ■
